Assessment	Description
Assignment 1	This is a <u>problem-based case assignment</u> . Learner selects skills learned to address a problem in solving them with intellectual independence.
Assignment 2	This is an <u>application-based case assignment</u> . Learner applies skills learned to address a range of complex unpredictable and/or abstract problems in solving them with intellectual independence and takes individual responsibility in the process.
Assignment 3	This is a <u>complex case-based assignment</u> . Learner selects skills to adopt a professional approach to operating in a complex environment including the design and development of creative approaches to the management of complex work processes in the case organization.
Final exam (Course 1-3)	Final exam is comprehensive with aim to evaluate the overall (in all the CLOs) accumulated knowledge and skills and competency in autonomy and responsibility acquired through the course. The learners demonstrate not only critical assessment skills but also demonstration of a responsible leadership in decision.
For Course 4	<ul> <li>Final examination is replaced by Poster Project presentation at the end of 5 weeks, and Project presentation at the end of 10 weeks with appropriate rubric as detailed in the course syllabus.</li> <li>Course 4 is exclusively hands-on so, there is no final examination. The course is thus, a Capstone course of GD-PHS which integrates learning in Course 1,2 and 3. Course is 4 assessed by 3 assignments 1,2,3 with 30%, 30%, 40% weight each and a final project in 2 phases (please see A.1 and A.2 structure and rubric for poster paper and research paper)</li> <li>Phase-1 at the end of 1<sup>st</sup> month with virtual poster presentations (50%) and</li> <li>Phase-2 at the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> month with deliverable being a research paper (using real-time or simulated data) to be published in <u>Scopus C Category</u> (50%). The trainee will be the 1<sup>st</sup> author with the instructor(s) delivering being the co-authors for effectively communicating the research results to the stakeholders.</li> <li>This research deliverable helps in building capacity of GD-PHS trainees to participate as research associates which builds their career in international PHS projects of NIH/CDC/WHO/USAID/UAE-MOE/GOI-MOE/ICMR and the like.)</li> </ul>
